Development of long-term care in the community

- Greater focus on support
- Move away from medical model
- Increasing attention to independent living and choice
- CRPD has helped advance this notion
- HOWEVER, still 1.5 million persons with disabilities in institutions
- In 13 EU Member states more institutionalised people than 10 years ago

What is an institution?

- isolation and segregation from the community;
- no or limited influence over whom one has to accept assistance from;
- lack of control over day-to-day decisions, such as what time to get up, what to eat, who you spend your free time with, etc.;
- lack of choice over whom to live with;
- not being able to decide freely when to visit friends or family, or having this decision taken by someone else;
- facing restrictions over if and when one can have guests over;
- rigidity of routine irrespective of personal will and preferences;
- Imposing group activities under the authority of the service provider



Human rights issues in institutions

Other than lack of freedom to choose, some cases of human rights abuses are more extreme

- Physical and psychological abuse
- Increased risk of sexual abuse
- People left vulnerable in times of force majeure
- Forced sterilisation



How to assist progress for community-based services

- Clearer rules on EU funding not going towards institutions
- Better protection for women and girls wirth disabilities against violence, abuse and forced sterilisation
- More support to boost the sector of service provision



- 24 percentage point employment gap in the EU
- Persons with disabilities earn less on average
- Only 29% or men and 20% of women with disabilities work full time
- Many still in sheltered workshops



- Loss of disability allowance
- Fear of in-work poverty
- Resistance to making work adaptations
- Insufficient knowledge of how to include workers with disabilities
- Gap in digital skills
