

The meeting will take place in Ilion at **EKA Hospital Thomas Klisiotis Hall**. The Hospital is located about 9 klm from the centre of Athens.



Getting Around



It is suggested that you reach the EKA Hospital by taxi.

To get there with taxi just mention the full adress above.







- There is a metro which connects most parts of the city and also the airport to the city centre. Carriages are quite frequent (every 4-10 minutes). The Metro runs daily from 5 am to midnight. You can find the english map here https://www.emetro.gr/?page_id=4449&lang=en
- Athens Metro Line 3 connects Athens Airport to Syntagma Square. A one-way subway ticket costs 9€. The price for a return ticket is 16€. You can purchase your tickets at the airport station ticket booths or through the automatic machines.
- Alternatively, you could buy a 3-day Tourist ticket, valid for buses, metro, and tram. The 3-dayticket includes a return ticket to Athens Airport and costs 20€.
- There is also an extensive line of buses, which sadly do not operate so regularly and times are not true as how they appear on bus stops. See here https://telematics.oasa.gr/en/#main.
- There is also a tram beginning from the city centre, Syntagma and which goes all the way in the south riviera of Athens, where you can walk along beaches, in the coastal suburbs of Faliro, Voula and Piraeus. It takes approximately 1hr to get from Syntagma Square to the final seaside stops at Voula or Piraeus.
- Tickets for buses, metro and tram are purchased at the metro stations in automated machines orkiosk. Taxis are also available and you can either stop them at the street or download the uber app or the free now app on your mobiles.
- Taxi fares are relatively low still, so many people use them(e.g. 10 euros for a 4 klm distance or for 20 minute ride).
- Please bare in mind that taxis you stop on the street do not accept cards, only cash.





How to get there: From the airport, take the blue metro line and get off at Syntagma station. Change there to the red metro line towards Anthoupoli. Get off after 3 stops at Metaxourgio station.

The city

Athens is Europe's oldest capital city. It has been inhabited since the late Neolithic era, evidence of early settlements dating from 4500 to 4000 BC.

According to Greek mythology the city was named after Athéna, the ancient Greek goddess of wisdom.

It is the birthplace of Democracy, comes from the Greek word "démos" – the people and "krátos" –the state

Major seightseeings include: The Parthenon, Theatre of Herodes Atticus (right picture), Panathenaic Stadium, Ancient Agora of Athens, Roman Agora, National Garden, Museum of Cycladic Art, Museum of Acropolis, National Archaeological Museum
