

## Particip.AGE – Why it Matters?

AIM: Supporting community participation and social inclusion of Ageing People with Intellectual Disabilities.

- Dual vulnerabilities: ageing + intellectual disabilities
- Often excluded from national strategies and public awareness
- At high risk of social isolation, institutionalisation, and digital exclusion







- Inaccessible environments and information
- Limited community awareness: weak interpersonal networks (family, friends)
- Digital divide and limited access to assistive technology
- Lack of inclusive and coordinated community services
- Persistent policy and data gaps: stereotypes
- Inadequate training for staff (not cross-specialised)
- Limited consultation and co-design of services





## Particip.AGE Project: Supporting Inclusion

- Promotes the recognition of rights, active citizenship, and dignity
- Focus on staff training and community awareness
  campaigns: encourage collaboration between disability and elderly care sectors
- Improve digital literacy and promote awareness and enhanced access to assistive technology
